### New Business

- Rob – raffle (9/25/2022)
- Boy Scout troop on Saturday, January 15<sup>th</sup> would like to camp out on that weekend (cabin campout, clean bathrooms, and the hall as well)
  - o November 11<sup>th</sup> – another Eagle Scout BOR in Oakham
  - o Another Eagle Scout has put in his application (club has supported 5 Eagle Scouts)

- Rifle/Firearms meets Hardwick Club
- Game Supper may be off or look to the mid-late spring to reschedule best case
- The DCR is going to have a Ware River Advisory meeting on January 22<sup>nd</sup> (Mike Woods selected as an advisory to this). Rutland historical commission received \$50,000 and want to protect the Rutland Prison area (talked about leveling it due to graffiti etc.). They are going to setup some kiosks to take pictures of QR codes, maps where the hospital was and the history of that prison camp. Effort to have other groups use that space and to keep the roads open and limiting or closing roads in the off season to avoid this. Putting this on the agenda for the January meeting.

### Old Business

Steel gongs on the pistol range – AR 500 \$38.87 a piece for 10” steel gongs (3 of them for handgun usage)

Cell phone booster purchased \$341.00 not installed but has been purchased installation on January 15, 2022. Probably put this in at the conclusion of hunting season (next closest is 2.9 miles and will amplify the signal for the club). This will accommodate all carriers. Need to install it at a future date. 120 power and the antenna does not need power. Glenn contacted Charter/Spectrum and they did a field evaluation and on 11.2 they finished the eval and \$97.97 a month a business account 200 mb/sec connectivity. Construction fee \$12,933 Spectrum will cover \$8,000 – remaining cost will be \$4,933 for the Club to cover. More information will be obtained on the process and what and where the termination and origination will proceed from. This will fee into the security camera among other items.

Phone is currently \$125.72 a month with Spectrum so we can cancel the phone and get internet. If we wanted to add TV additional or we could live stream shows or the Gun Raffle if desired. May be able to save the club phone # and keep it? Glenn will check on this – straight transfer and goes to the fire panels.

Research on the fobs and the camera system updates. Security cameras through Amazon – no charge and there is no monitoring fee. This may be an option to evaluate at a future date.

6 – 7 pheasant youth hunt, 20 birds and released over the backstop. A few did get away and then were hunted with dogs. 3 birds in remote controlled launchers in the upper field and had the kids hunt that
