### New Business

We are having a code inspection at 9:30 am on November 16<sup>th</sup> and a Health inspection as well (Mike would like to do this ahead of the health inspections). The 16<sup>th</sup> is a Wednesday and the clean up will be held on the evening of November 15<sup>th</sup> (One Call on Monday, November 14<sup>th</sup>)

**November 17<sup>th</sup> a meeting at Ware River Watershed, meeting at the Rutland library at 7 pm** and Mike and Tom are on the board of directors. There is a concern there may be a restrictive access enabled over the next 10 years. Mike put an editorial in the Barre Gazette as well. 30-day period for public comments and concerns, then if it implemented it will be hard to do. Investing options for the club's money, Fidelity is earning 3% over 11 months. Paid for heating oil, need to pay the property insurance, liquor liability and the inspections – aside from operating expenses. So, nothing significant, unless there are repairs that need to be done, April dues will be coming in. We are looking to put in a parcel of the funds and invest them into that account. We could do this year over year as well. Mike looked at an 11 month – CD for investing club funds in. Janet will follow-up to get more information on this fund.
